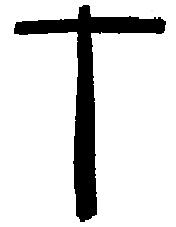

SUMMARY POINTS FROM PROVINCIAL CHAPTER – 16-18 OCTOBER 2015

Chapter welcomed another guest Area Minister (Roz Graham – Canterbury). John Lovatt was commissioned as the Provincial Treasurer and we prayed farewell to John Reynolds.

Further to the change of programme announced in the latest *Little Portion*, a great amount of time, prayer and work was devoted to the all-important issue of General Chapter. The valuable foundation work of the Steering Group was reviewed and refined, as were the questions to be considered by the Local Groups before being brought by Area Representatives to the Convocation in 2017. These questions will be sent out at the end of the month, so that detailed consideration and discussion can be undertaken by the Local Groups in coming months.

Chapter offered sincere thanks and appreciation for all the work in developing the concept for the General Chapter and laying the essential foundations for the Working Group to build on. Detailed planning is under way to achieve a meaningful convocation. Areas will be kept fully informed of details and progress.

The film *Finding Saint Francis* will have its premiere in London on 5 November 2015. Further details later in this issue of TON and on the TSSF Web-site.

Training for Local Group Conveners 'Forming Franciscan Communities' is oversubscribed. The first session, in London on 14 November, is likely to be followed by two more sessions in Spring 2016, probably in the Manchester and Somerset areas.

The Area Team handbook is being updated and will be put on the TSSF Web-site for reference. It can be downloaded and printed as necessary.

Link Tertiaries will consult with their Areas, to determine whether they might wish to adjust the shape of their Areas in the interests of numbers, communication and travel considerations. They will also be asked to confirm their preference for Area and Cluster names, in the interest of consistency.

A new Minister Provincial for the African Province has been elected to replace Nolan Tobias. He is Revd. Dr. Michael Twum-Darko.

A booklet on TSSF Principles, containing associated thoughts and prayers for each day, is being made available from the Province of the Pacific, together with a booklet of 'The Francis Stories'. Each of these booklets will be available to order from Third Order Distribution, priced at £3:50 each. Details are later in this issue of TON.

The new JPIC co-ordinator from mid-2016 will be Philippa Bird. The JPIC Steering Group is developing Guidance for the JPIC co-ordinator and Area Representatives, as well as reviewing the name. Arrangements are in hand for a JPIC weekend at Alnmouth, on 15-17 April 2016.

The financial accounts for Year 2014-15 were presented to Chapter by the outgoing Treasurer, after scrutiny by the Finance Sub Group and our Independent Examiners. They were accepted by the Trustees and signed off by our Minister Provincial. Concern was expressed at the small number of Tertiaries who Gift Aid their contributions currently.

NEW MINISTER PROVINCIAL FOR THE PACIFIC PROVINCE

The new Minister Provincial for the Pacific Province is Maggie Smith, below is a letter from Maggie to us all.



‘I am married to Geoff. We have two children and five grandchildren. Most of our married life has been spent farming together on our South Island Canterbury sheep farm. There were the usual rural involvements in pre-school, schools, Brownies, Red Cross and church. We developed 25 acres of our farm as wetlands along creeks, ponds and springs and offered our property as a Quiet Garden for retreat days. When we moved to the North Island three years ago, we began a new wetlands project on our very modest five acres in the Wairarapa, near our son’s farm.

I was ordained a priest in 1993 and served in various parishes in the Christchurch diocese including (after retirement) a six month stint in a city parish supporting a Vicar in a damaged earthquake area of the city and another month to allow a stressed vicar leave from a badly hit suburb.

I belonged to the Association of Anglican Women, leading on to the Overseas and Outreach role and later Chaplain for the Diocese; to the Order of St Luke for about thirty years, serving in different leadership roles.

I am a spiritual director and love this ministry – such a privilege! It was near the end of my training with Spiritual Growth Ministries that I heard of the Third Order. I had no second thoughts about following up and, later, was able to be chaplain of the Christchurch group until we moved north. I have been graciously welcomed to the Wellington group and to the church here and made to feel very much part of the fellowship and community.

Geoff and I spent a week in Assisi. I fell in love with the chapel at San Damiano. In the dim, quiet coolness of the chapel, the words of Christ to St Francis seem to whisper in the air: “Repair my church”. Perhaps this is part of our task as Franciscans – to keep repairing, restoring, renewing the church to the devotion, simplicity, faith and inclusiveness of Francis and to a sense of oneness with all creation.’

VOLUNTEER APPEAL:
SPIRITUAL DIRECTION –
WHAT'S IT LIKE FOR YOU?

This appeal appeared first in TON for July 2015. I am very grateful to those who responded then, but I'd like to make a second appeal to those who may have missed it first time round. I'm looking for tertairies who would be willing, in principal, to respond to a questionnaire about their experience of spiritual direction as directee or director.

I'm in the third and final year of a part time study in Christian Spirituality at Sarum College at Salisbury. For my dissertation, I'm investigating the essential elements in Spiritual Direction, and how it can contribute to adult faith formation, and I'd like to support the investigation by tapping into the experience of the Third Order.

The scope of the questionnaire will be defined by Sarum's ethical requirements, particularly with regard to confidentiality, under the direction of the University of Winchester. There will be no attempt to identify or make contact with anyone's Spiritual Director, all responses will be anonymised and there will be no follow up without the explicit permission of the respondent.

It wouldn't be appropriate for me to approach tertiaries in my own area of Cumbria and Lancashire, where I'm currently serving as Area Minister. But I hope folk from other areas might be willing to take part.

HORN PARK COMMUNITY CENTRE PROJECT **IN LONDON SOUTH**

The Bishop of Woolwich, Michael Ipgrave found a wonderful stained glass window in the East end of a small brick church in the middle of the Horn Park estate in Lee, SE 12. The estate is sandwiched between busy main roads. The church was built in 1953 and is dedicated to St Francis. The window has seven panels – St Francis, St Peter, St John and the Virgin Mary, with the middle three panels depicting Jesus in glory surrounded by angels and musicians, with a Nativity scene beneath.

The church has now become a secular Community centre hosting many activities every day. The Management Committee run it so it sustains itself without any funds or grants from local authorities. However the centre only just breaks even now so there are no funds available for extras such as protecting and repairing the window, It is in need of protection immediately as it is already riddled with holes and cracks. At one point they wondered about having it taken out and selling it off for extra funds.

Bishop Michael appealed to London South Tertiaries to see if we could help, not only in protecting and restoring the window, but in bringing the Holy Spirit and the Spirit of St Francis back into the community with this hub at its centre.

We took up the challenge by having a meeting in September with eight of us Tertiaries from London South, and Bishop Michael with the trustees of the centre together with Trevor Clarke, a Church Army Captain who is already busy reminding the community that this is still a holy place even though it is not used as a church anymore. The upshot of this meeting was that we unanimously decided to try and raise money to protect the window, and hopefully eventually restore it.

We are busy getting estimates for protecting the window straight away and our first fund raising idea is to have a card made of the window. These cards are available now at £10 for 10 and could be used as Christmas cards, but having no message inside they can be used all the year around. We are already getting to know the folk that come to the centre for the Drop In Café on Wednesday mornings and will be having packing the cards sessions. We hope to sell the cards in the local shops.

If you want to know more about the Horn Park Community Centre, or buy cards all you have to do is to visit their website www.hornpark.org.uk. There you will be able to see the window in colour, and see about all the other activities going on at Horn Park.

BEING A LINK TERTIARY

Being a link tertiary is a great opportunity to become more involved with wider community of TSSF; and to meet other tertiaries from throughout the European Province. The post involves some travel, both to attend meetings and to get to know their own Areas. Listening skills are a great asset for the post as each Area has its own character and different priorities and requirements. Links are a communication channel. When attending Chapter meetings, Links can pass on what they learn about the good things which happen in their own Areas and share this with other Areas, so we can learn from each others experience. They also pass on any requests from their Areas for guidance or information from Provincial Chapter and return with information.

Chapter meetings happen three times a year, and are not only an opportunity to pass on information from their Areas to Chapter but also an opportunity to gather information from Chapter and take it back to their Areas. Chapter cannot serve the Province unless they know what is happening at the grassroots.

Another important aspect of the post of Link tertiary is that, as members of Provincial Chapter, they also become trustees of the province.

Being in post has had it's challenges but I personally have found that it has been a rewarding experience.
